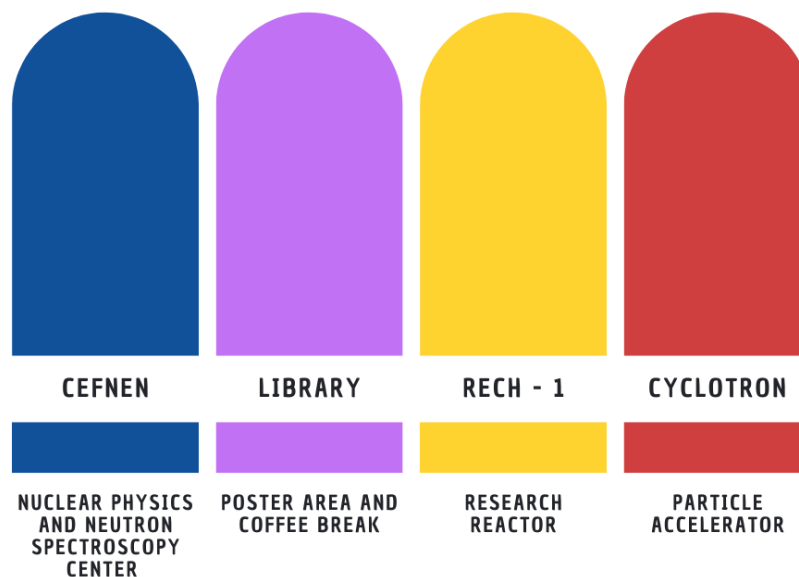


Recommendations for the access to the
Chilean Nuclear Energy Commission and Program

1. **Recommendations:**

- Please, have your passport or identification card ready to be shown at the entrance of the facilities to the military authorities.
- Within the facilities, the participants must consistently follow the instructions provided by the host or hostess.
- Each area will be marked with a color-coded pattern to facilitate access identification:

AREA IDENTIFICACION



- No touching of any items in controlled areas or facilities is permitted. In the unlikely event of accidental contact with a radioactive substance, immediate notification must be given to the person in charge or facility supervisor.



- The controlled areas will be marked with a trisector, which must be purple with yellow contrast, according to NCh 1410 OF 78 and its shape is based on NCh 1411/1 OF 78.



*NCh 1410 OF 78 and NCh 1411/1 OF 78 are the official Chilean indicators of radioactive material, it establishes a signaling system to assess the existing risk in a premises or area where hazardous materials are manufactured, stored, or used.

- In controlled areas, consumption of food, or liquids is strictly prohibited.
- Try to bring only the necessary items that you may need, items that may fall or be left behind within controlled areas is strictly prohibited.
- Pregnant individuals or those suspecting pregnancy are not permitted to enter controlled zones.
- Photography and videography are permitted within the facilities, provided it is authorized by the responsible individuals overseeing the facilities.
- Wearing shorts is not allowed, and closed-toe shoes with securely fastened laces must be worn. Participants are advised not to wear high heels to prevent falls or accidents.
- It is recommended to use a sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF) equal to or greater than 30.
- Upon receiving a personal dosimeter, participants must wear it at all times, following the provided instructions.
- In case of emergencies such as earthquakes or fires, individuals must adhere to the instructions given by the radiological protection specialist or the group guide.
- Lastly, it is crucial to note that each person must carry their identification card or physical passport on the day of the visit (photographs are not accepted). For Chileans, in case you are in the process of obtaining an identification document (due to loss or expiration), this must be proven with the corresponding proof issued by the Civil Chilean Registry.
